

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Institution strongly believes in creating a just society through right education to the students. Keeping in view the betterment of the students, the management expects certain disciplinary practices from the students.

Office Hours:

The College office functions from 08:30a.m. to 02:30p.m on all the working days. Request for certificates, testimonials and other documents that require Principal's signature should be addressed to the Principal and submitted to the College Office. Certificates will be issued only with a minimum of 3 days prior notice.

College Timing & Morning Prayer

The college appreciates and acknowledges the students' punctuality and discipline. The college opens at 8.20 am in the morning and closes at 1.30 pm in the evening for students. For those who have practical, the classes will be till 3.30 pm. The Students are required to enter the college premises by 8.20 am and occupy their places in the class rooms by 8.20 am. The college gates remain closed thereafter. All the students are expected to be in their classes for Prayer at 8.25 a.m. The late comers are obliged to do the assignments given to them.

Personal Discipline

Regularity, Obedience, Courtesy in Speech and Conduct, respect for elders, cleanliness in dress and person is expected from every student. Irregular attendance, disobedience and objectionable conduct will justify dismissal. The personal copy of the Handbook/Calendar must be brought to the college every day. The personal bio data form has to be filled by every student immediately after receiving the Handbook.

ID Card

The student shall carry her ID card every day to the college and shall produce it at the gate and when required.

Attendance

80% of attendance in each subject is compulsory. Students falling short of the attendance will not be permitted to write the semester examinations. If a student is absent for an hour on a day without permission, she shall be marked absent for the whole day.

Absence & Late Coming

If a student is absent for more than six days, her name will be removed from the roll. A student who has been absent for the classes & coming late will not be admitted to the class without the Principal's permission. All such permission shall be entered in the college calendar or leave card only. The Students who come late will obtain the signature of the faculty incharge or Security on a late coming attendance record sheet of the Handbook at the gate.

Leave

Leave of absence will not be granted to the student except for serious reasons and prior written application from the parents or guardian. If a student absents herself without prior permission, she must bring her parent/guardian to the college and meet the Principal. The student will not be given leave for Marriage and maternity. The students can only avail the 20% leave for Medical or for any other reason. No student will be permitted to leave the college during the working hours and lunch hours.

Mobile Phones

The mobile phones are strictly prohibited in the classroom and in the college premises. If any student is found using the mobile phone, it would be confiscated and the mobile phone will be returned at the end of the academic year. If there is an emergency the students can use the college phone available in the office.

Ragging

Ragging is a criminal offense against the Law. College would not encourage such activities in the campus; any issues related to this can be addressed to the college authorities. If any such crime found, the student would be called for action i.e Cancellation of Admission, Suspension from the college and punishment.

Safety

The student is required to submit six pass port size photographs and a family photograph at the time of admission. This would ensure the safety of the student at any strange situation.

Damage

Any damage done to the college property will have to be compensated by the students. Students should not tamper with fan regulators and switch boards and ought to switch off the fans and lights before leaving the class rooms.

Cleanliness

Student should use the dustbins and co-operate in keeping the campus, classrooms, laboratory, Library and lavatory neat & clean.

Writing on Wall

Writing and sticking bills on college walls or on desks is strictly prohibited.

Free Hour

Students should utilize their free hours by visiting the library for reading books, Magazines and News Papers etc. available in the library.

Vehicle

Students using vehicles must possess a valid driving licence

Problem Situations

Any issues or a serious settlement of students / staff to be brought to the notice of Principal and Secretary. No other persons than parents are allowed as mediators.

Valuables & Personal Belongings

No student is permitted to bring expensive goods/ gadgets like laptops, Mobile Phones, I Phones, I pods, Jewellery and money worth more value along with them to the college. In case of losing anything of this kind, the Management will not take responsibility. The students and the Parents are expected to follow this strictly.

MISCONDUCT

Any student found to have a record of the following misconduct is subject to the disciplinary action:

- ❖ Acts of dishonesty: Cheating, plagiarism or other forms of academic dishonesty.
- ❖ Furnishing false information to any College official, faculty member or office.
- ❖ Forgery, alteration or misuse of college document, record, or instrument of identification.
- Disruption of teaching, research, administration, disciplinary proceedings, college activities when the act occurs in college premises.

- Physical assault and sexual assault, latter including all criminal sexual conduct as defined by the laws of the State.
- ❖ Attempted or actual theft of or damage to property of the college or property of a member of the college community or other personal or public property.
- ❖ Hazing which endangers the mental or physical health or safety of a student or which destroys or removes public or private property for the purpose of initiation, admission into, affiliation with or as a condition for continued membership in a group or organization. Failure to comply with the directions of the college officials or law enforcement officers acting in performance of their duties or failure to identify oneself to these persons when requested to do so.
- Unauthorized possession, duplication or use of keys or access to any college buildings or devices is restricted. Unauthorized entry or presence within enclosed college buildings even when unlocked is prohibited.
- ❖ Violation of any College Policy, Rule, or Regulation published in hard copy or available electronically on the college website.
- No weapons of any kind are allowed in the campus.
- ❖ Participation in campus demonstration that disrupts the normal operations of the College and infringes the rights of members of the College community; leading or inciting others to disrupt scheduled and/or normal activities within any campus building or area; intentional obstruction which unreasonably interferes with freedom of movement, either pedestrian or vehicular, on campus.

- Profane or obscene expressions including, but not limited to speech, which violate accepted standards of decency and Christian conduct.
- ❖ Sexual misconduct including, but not limited to, sexual relations outside marriage, involvement with pornography, internet cybersex or other internet sexual misconduct.
- Students should not raise fund or make any collection in cash or any kind without the prior consent of the Principal/Secretary

VIOLATION OF LAW AND COLLEGE DISCIPLINE

- ❖ When a student is charged with violation of the Student Conduct Code, the College may institute disciplinary proceedings.
- ❖ When a student is charged by state, or local authorities with a violation of law, the College will not request or agree to special consideration for that individual because of her status as a student. The College will cooperate fully with the law enforcement agencies in the enforcement of law.

RULES TO BE FOLLOWED IN LABORATORIES

Computer Lab

- Students are expected to approach the HOD or System Admin to solve the issues of Technical and infra structural problems
- Students are not allowed to take prints without prior permission
- Students should take off their shoes and arrange the shoes in the rack provided outside the lab.
- Students are responsible for their personal belongings.
- When the students enter the lab, they should sign in the log book.
- Students should always be seated in the system allotted to them.
- Students are not allowed to play games in the computers, if found, they will be suspended from the lab session.
- Students are not allowed to use the internet without prior permission of the teacher.
- Staff of the respective department monitors effective utilization of the laboratories.
- Strict silence has to be maintained in the Lab

Psychology Lab

- Students should follow the Lab timings strictly.
- Students are expected to maintain discipline while working in the lab.
- No student will be allowed to enter or access the tests without the prior permission of lab in charge.
- Students are not allowed to have snacks and lunch inside the lab.
- Chairs to be arranged properly while leaving the lab.
- Return of test items should be made timely to avoid any inconvenience.
- After the practical work has been done students should keep back the practical materials in the designated place.

Physics Lab

Experiential learning is the key to progress in science. Therefore, systematic, careful lab work is an essential part of any science program. Fundamental laboratory procedures and techniques are practiced during practical hours to pursue new knowledge.

The equipment's and apparatuses used in physics, electronics and optics laboratories involve various safety hazards. With the active involvement of Faculty and Student the risks can be minimized so that working in the laboratory can be a safe and enjoyable process of discovery.

SAFETY RULES TO BE FOLLOWED IN THE LAB:

1. Avoid wearing long necklaces, dangling bracelets or bulky jewelry, and loose-fitting clothing on lab days. Long hair should be tied back. Loose, dangling items may get caught in moving parts, accidentally contact electrical connections, or interfere with the investigation in a potentially hazardous manner.

- 2. Carry observation notebook, record, graph sheets, calculator and other stationaries required. Keep other books and bags in designated storage area.
- 3. Read the entire experiment before entering the lab for safety precautions involved in the experiments.
- 4. Do not perform unauthorized experiments or use materials and equipment in a manner for which they were not intended.
- 5. Food, beverages, and chewing gum are NEVER permitted in the laboratory.
- 6. Do not work with any batteries, electrical devices, or magnets other than those provided by your teacher.
- 7. Do not mishandle or play with the equipment specially designed for performing experiments.
- 8. Keep the apparatus clean and rearrange it in an orderly manner, and report any damaged or missing items to the teacher.
- 9. Work in the lab only under the supervision of your teacher or lab assistant.
- 10. Do not leave equipment unattended while it is in operation.

Mathematics Lab

- Students should follow the lab timings strictly.
- Students are requested to leave their footwear's outside the Lab.
- Students are not allowed to carry their bags and cell phones inside the lab.
- After entering the lab, students should sign in the Log Book.
- Students should sit in the allotted systems only; changing of system is not encouraged.

- Students should not move around the lab hours.
- Using of pen drive is strictly banned without prior permission.
- Refreshments are not allowed inside the lab.
- They should arrange their chair while leaving the lab.
- Students are informed to shut down the systems and switch off the lights before leaving the lab.

While using computers Students should

- Be safe: It works on electricity. Be gentle: It is delicate.
- Keep it clean: It is sensitive to dust.
- Keep a correct posture: It can cause injury. Share equally: It is for everyone.

Rehabilitation Science Lab

- Students should follow the lab timing strictly.
- The students are asked to maintain discipline in the lab.
- Food and drink are not allowed inside the lab.
- Students should not carry their bags and valuables things inside the lab.
- Students should not move around during the lab hours.
- When the students take the braille typewriter, walker and abacus they are required to enter the details along with their signatures in the lab book.
- The materials taken should be kept back in the respective places.

Commerce Lab

- Students should follow the lab timing strictly.
- Food and drink are not allowed inside the lab.
- Students should not carry their bags and valuables inside the lab.
- Chairs always should be pushed back close to the desk when they leave the lab.
- Students should not move around during the lab hours.
- Students should not use their pen drive or cd drive without the prior permission of the lab admin.
- When the students enter the lab, they should sign in the log book.
- Students should always be seated in the system allotted to them.
- Students are not allowed to play games in the computers, if found, they will be suspended from the lab session.
- Students are not allowed to use the internet without prior permission of the teacher.
- Staff of the respective department monitor effective utilization of the laboratories

LIBRARY RULES

- ID card should be carried to the Library to access books
- Library membership is given to students for one academic year.
- Books issued are to be returned within 8 days after which 2 renewals can be permitted.
- Personnel books and files are not to be taken inside the library.
- Maintain silence and discipline in the library.
- Library books will be issued between 11:00 to 02:30 pm
- Reference books are not for circulation.
- Sign in the register when you enter the library.
- Do not make any mark with pen/pencil in the book
- Do not fold/tear the pages.
- The books taken from the shelves must be left on the table and not to be kept on the shelves.
- Students are permitted to take 3 reference books from the library during the examination.
- Renewal of books is not allowed during exams.
- Students have to pay late fine if they don't return/renew the book in time.
- Overdue charge is Rs.2/- per day per book.
- Student can refer the reference book in the library during library hours by submitting I card. They have to return the book on the same day
- For book damage, fine will be charged 100% of the book cost.
- In case of book loss, students have to replace the book of the same author and latest edition or will have to pay book mentioned price.
- In case of loss of library Borrower card, students have to fill the fresh application for getting new borrower card.

FEE REGULATIONS

- Fee once paid will not be refunded for any reasons.
- ❖ The student has to be alert to all the announcements with regard to paying the college fees, Exam fees and oblige to pay them on or before the stipulated date. If failed she has to pay with fine.
- ❖ The last minute payment at the time of Semester Exams will not be permitted. The students and the Parents need to accept the decision of the college in case of delay or Non Payment.

DRESS CODE

Dress code is not about what is convenient to wear as girls but convincing to wear as students of St. Anne. Hence, Students are expected to wear simple and modest clothes and they are permitted to wear Chudithar with Dupattas pinned or Jeans with long closed tops.

Good attire is a best way of presenting oneself. The Students show Indianness in dressing by not wearing tight tops, short tops, sleeveless tops, T-Shirts, skirts and three forth pants. All are expected to be modest in their attire, if any student found wearing indecent dress will be charged a fine of R.500.

RULES OF ATTENDANCE

- 1. 5 Marks per paper in every semester is being allotted for regular attendance to the classes.
- 2. Attendance is being taken at the beginning of every class hour.
- 3. Attendance is compulsory on the reopening day, closing day; seminar days, department programs, and industrial visit. Attendance is compulsory for all the special activities of the College.
- 4. Student who wishes to avail leave for one day has to get permission from the Class Teacher by a written letter, for two days from the HOD and for more days, from the Principal. Students who are absent due to illness should also produce the medical certificate.
- 5. Student who avails leave is expected to obtain signature from her parent/Guardian and the class teacher in the record of absence sheet provided in the Hand book.
- 6. Student can obtain monthly attendance status from the Class Teacher. Name of the students who have shortage of attendance will be displayed on the notice board at the end of every month.
- 7. Students are expected to get 100% attendance. Appreciation certificate of attendance will be issued to students who score 100% attendance at the end of the year.

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION SYSTEM

The College follows the same Semester system of the Bengaluru City University, Bengaluru.

- 1. Each semester has two periodical tests, two assignments, seminar, model exam and attendance as part of the internal assessment for 40 marks Theory Paper.
- 2. University Exam at the end of each Semester for 60 marks Theory Paper.
- 3. University Practical Exam is conducted at the end of each semester.
- 4. 75% of attendance is compulsory to appear for University Exam.
- 5. All the eligible students who appear for the examination for the first time in any semester should pay the examination fee in full for all the subjects whether the candidate writes the examination or not.
- 6. Students reported of malpractice in examination will be severely dealt with and even dismissed.
- 7. No student who is admitted to college is automatically eligible for the university examination. At her due discretion the Principal, may direct any student to withdraw from the examination, either to student's repeated poor performance in studies, or irregular attendance, or indulging in any unwanted activities.

Minimum Pass Mark

Candidates who have obtained a minimum of 35% marks in university examination (i.e. 21 marks out of 60 marks of theory examination) and 40% in aggregate in each subject shall be eligible for a pass or exemption in that subject.
